

FESTIVAL CANCELLATION POLICY

If there is a school closure in the Hanover School Division due to a storm day, Festival classes scheduled at the SRSS will be cancelled, however classes at non-school venues will continue as scheduled for the day and evening. Awards nights (including the Southeastern Stars Gala) also will not be cancelled. If the Hanover School Division announces a school closure due to extreme cold, Festival classes will continue as scheduled. We will make every effort to reschedule cancelled classes, subject to adjudicator availability. School cancellations will be announced on Mix 96.7 FM, Country 107, AM 1250, and steinbachonline.com. DEFINITIONS AND REGULATIONS

PROVINCIAL MUSIC & SPEECH ARTS FESTIVAL

(Addendum to Provincial Syllabus 2015 Edition, p. ii - iii)

PROVINCIAL MUSIC FINALS REGULATIONS

(Addendum to Provincial Syllabus 2015 Edition, p. iii - ix)

1. Eligibility

Competitors in ensemble classes must choose the division corresponding to or higher than their solo entry/entries. If two or more competitors are in different age categories, they must enter the higher age category in ensemble classes.

SEMF requires that competitors in **all solo classes (including Musical Theatre)** must perform in two or more solo classes at the same grade/age group in the same discipline to be eligible for a Provincial Final recommendation. One of these classes must be a Provincial Finals eligible class.

Please note that first place winners of Provincial Finals Music classes may now be eligible to compete at the same level provided they are recommended from a local festival class one grade higher than the previous year.

2. Provincial Recommendation

Adjudicators may recommend **one or two representatives** (and an alternate) at each level indicated from each of the eligible disciplines. See page 14 for more information.

3. Performance Requirements

Participants who choose to enter classes for <u>adjudication only</u> may not do so at a lower level than his/her competitive entries.

4. Accompaniment

The intent of SEMF and the Provincial Finals is to have live performances by both the performer and the piano accompanist; however, some situations may require modification of this rule and will be assessed on an individual basis. SEMF will not be obligated to provide a sound system if needed.

5. Access Copyright License

Festival participants may reproduce selections from the Speech Arts manual or other source as described in the Provincial Syllabus 2015 Edition. All entrants in Speech Arts classes must provide the adjudicator with an original or a photocopy of each selection.

6. Original Scores

Performers are encouraged to perform from memory, but when a score is required, it must be an original and not a photocopy. All entrants must provide an original selection for the adjudicator's use. Legal electronic downloads must be accompanied by a receipt, with the exception of music downloaded from IMSLP (Public domain source). No marks will be given when unauthorized photocopies are used. As well, the entrant will be ineligible for awards with that selection. Entrants providing selections for the adjudicator's use must have their books open and marked with their name and the class number. All music that is in loose page format must be presented stapled together or bound in some way. *Photocopies are not allowed except:*

- where an entrant produces a letter from the publisher giving permission to photocopy.
- where an entrant produces correspondence from the publisher or music supplier, dated 60 days prior, stating the item is backordered and payment has been received.
- where a selection from a current high school operetta is selected for performance and permission to photocopy has been obtained.

7. Marking

The following classes will be adjudicated with no marks given: **Choral**, **Dance** (all classes designated as ribbon category - 6 years and under), **Guitar** (Beginner to Grade 2), **Instrumental** (Beginner to Grade 2), **Junior Piano** (Beginner to Grade 2), **Speech/Theatre Arts** (Kindergarten to Grade 3), **Strings** (Suzuki and Beginner to Grade 2), **Musical Theatre** (10 years and under), **Vocal** (10 years and under).

- Entrants have the option of participating non-competitively in any of the other competitive classes. Please mark the entry form box "This is a non-competitive entry".
- For competitive classes, SEMF will use a combination numeral and letter grading system. Participants placing first and second will receive a numerical grade and all other participants in the same class will receive a letter grade.
- Winners of classes in which awards are given must have a mark of 80 or more to be eligible to perform for the award.
- As a general guide, the following marking system is used:

Grade	Mark	Performance Standard
A +	90 to 100	signifies superior performance
A	85 to 89	signifies distinction
A -	80 to 84	signifies definite merit
В	75 to 79	signifies adequate
С	70 to 74	signifies fair standard

Note: Dance uses a different marking system, please see page 16.

The decision of the adjudicator regarding ranking of participants must be accepted as final. At no time must anyone approach the adjudicator to discuss the matter.

8. Class Specific Regulations

Provincial eligible classes begin with the letter "P". Read the Provincial Syllabus 2015 Edition for more detailed information.

9. General Procedures

SEMF Classes: SEMF will consider creating new classes to accommodate entries not eligible in existing classes. Note: Requests for new classes must be submitted by September 1 to be considered for the following year's festival.

Programming: The order of performances and approximate times will be shown in the official program. Programs will be on sale February 1 at the Cultural Arts Centre and Outbach Music.

The SEMF Executive reserves the right to grant or deny requests for program changes, to eliminate any class, and to create or remove finals in any class.

Requests for Scheduling Changes: All requests for scheduling changes must be received in writing (email or letter form; NO text messages), at least two weeks before the discipline start date.

Scheduling changes will cause the entry to become for adjudication only. Send requests to SEMF, Box 3334, Steinbach, MB R5G 1P6 or hand deliver to the President or discipline coordinator. These requests will be evaluated by the Discipline Coordinator, the President and Vice-President. Please state your circumstances clearly in written form. SEMF does not guarantee that requested scheduling changes will be possible.

MULTI-DISCIPLINE & SPECIAL CLASSES

ENTRY CHECKLIST
Only complete entry forms will be accepted.
Print clearly.
No staples or tape please.
Do not write on the back of the entry form.
Use correct class number and complete class name (copy this from the Provincial Syllabus 2015 Edition).
Remember the composer and title of larger work if applicable.
You may pay for more than one entry form with one cheque.
IMPORTANT! All entries must be received by December 1 st . No late entries will be accepted, no exceptions.

ENTRY FORMS

Entries may be mailed to the Southeastern Manitoba Festival; Box 3334, Steinbach, Manitoba, R5G 1P6; or placed in the Steinbach Cultural Arts Centre book drop in a sealed envelope containing the entry fee. There will be no "late deadline", and you must submit your entries on or before December 1, 2018. Exceptions will not be granted if you miss the December 1st deadline.

ABSOLUTELY NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER DECEMBER 1, 2018.

- Entries received by mail will be accepted if they are postmarked by December 1, 2018. Entries dropped off at the Steinbach Cultural Arts Centre must be received on or before December 1, 2018. No entries will be accepted after December 1st.
- There are separate entry forms for: SOLO, ENSEMBLE (2 4 participants), GROUP (5+ participants), CHOIRS (Choral Workshop) and DANCE. **Incomplete entries will not be accepted.**
- CLASS NUMBER and CLASS NAME should be copied as written in Provincial Syllabus or SEMF Addendum for accuracy.
- All entries must include the entry fee, preferably by cheque. Do not mail cash.
- Changes will not be permitted once an entry has been received by SEMF.
- Executive reserves the right to redirect entries to a more appropriate class. Teachers will be notified of the change.
- Entrants are urged to check for possible conflicts with festival dates and indicate these on the entry form.
- All entries submitted to SEMF are at the participant's own risk.

AWARD PROCEDURE

1. GENERAL PROCEDURE

- A. All scholarships, trophies and medals will be awarded subject to a sufficient number of entries. Scholarships, trophies and medals will be changed as needed at the SEMF Executive's discretion.
- B. <u>Piano, Vocal, Musical Theatre, Speech/Theatre Arts, Strings/Instrumental:</u> To be eligible for all solo awards, scholarships, and provincial recommendations, entrants must perform in two solo classes in these disciplines. Please carefully read on p. 23 requirements for Musical Theatre awards.
- C. Winners in duet classes may compete for the same award for two years.
- D. Trophy winners may not receive both a trophy and a medal in the same category.

2. CERTIFICATES

- A. First and Second Place Certificates will be awarded for each class. Duplicates will be given to duet, trio and quartet classes. Groups of 5 or more will receive only one certificate. All other participants will receive a certificate of participation or a participation ribbon.
- B. Certificates of Participation will be awarded to all Choirs.
- C. Gold Honours, Gold, High Silver, Silver or Bronze Certificates will be awarded in Dance to all entries other than ribbon entries and '6 years and under'. Duplicates will be given to duo and trio classes.

3. MEDALS

- A. In the Piano, Vocal, Musical Theatre, and Guitar disciplines, medal winners are selected on the basis of their performance in the final medal competition. There will be no final medal competition for Speech/Theatre Arts and Strings/Instrumental.
- B. Winners of medal classes may compete in the same age category for two years.
- C. Duplicate medals will be given to winners in duet, trio and quartet classes. Groups of 5 or more will receive only one medal.
- D. Trophy winners cannot receive both a trophy and a medal in the same category.

4. SCHOLARSHIPS

- A. Scholarships will be awarded to a competitor that the adjudicator feels shows promise and is deserving in their discipline.
- B. To be eligible for scholarships, entrants must perform in two solo classes in their discipline.
- C. An entrant may not win the same scholarship more than two consecutive years.

5. TROPHIES

- A. The trophy winner will be the TOP performer in his/her section. The contestant's outstanding total performance and marks throughout the week shall be taken into consideration by the adjudicator. However, it does not necessarily follow that the competitor with the highest mark in his/her category receives the trophy. In all cases, the adjudicator's decision is final.
- B. Trophy winners may compete for two years in the same level, but must perform different repertoire.
- C. An entrant may not win the same trophy more than two consecutive years. An exception may be permitted if there is only one eligible competitor. SEMF Executive reserves the right to make this final decision.
- D. Trophies that are competed for annually shall be returned to the Awards Convener at least one month prior to the ensuing year's festival.
- E. Trophy winners will be asked to perform one selection at the Southeastern Stars Gala. All trophies will be presented at this time.
- F. Trophy winners are not eligible for medals in the same category.

6. AWARDS NIGHTS

- A. Awards Nights are final competitions for class winners in the following disciplines: Junior Piano, Senior Piano, Vocal, and Musical Theatre.
- B. Competitors are asked to make sure they have prepared the correct number of pieces for their level. Competitors may be required to verbally announce the piece(s) they are performing from onstage. Also, be prepared to hand in original copies of their selection(s) for awards nights.
- C. No marks will be given at Awards Nights.
- D. Winners of recital classes do not continue on to the Awards Nights.

E. Piano:

Solo competitors in grades 3 and 4 will be required to perform one selection at the Awards Night which will consist of the piece of the class he/she won.

Solo competitors in grades 5 and up will be required to perform two selections at the Awards Night which will consist of the piece of the class he/she won AND an additional own choice selection.

F. Vocal:

Solo competitors up to and including the Intermediate level will be required to perform one selection at the Awards Night which will consist of the festival song of the class he/she won.

Solo competitors in the Grade A, Grade B and Honours levels will be required to perform two selections at the Awards Night which will consist of the festival song of the class he/she won, AND an additional own choice selection.

G. Musical Theatre:

Solo competitors will be required to perform one selection at the Awards Night which will consist of the festival song of the class he/she won.
