If there is a school closure in the Hanover School Division due to a storm or extreme cold day, daytime Choral classes will be cancelled, however all other disciplines will continue as scheduled for the day and evening. Awards nights also will not be cancelled. Attendance will be up to each entrant according to their discretion and at their own risk. We will make every effort to reschedule cancelled classes, subject to adjudicator availability. School cancellations will be announced on Mix 96.7 FM, Country 107, AM 1250, and steinbachonline.com. GENERAL SEMF REGULATIONS

1. Eligibility

Competitors in ensemble classes must choose the division corresponding to or higher than their solo entry/entries. If two or more competitors are in different age categories, they must enter the higher age category in ensemble classes.

SEMF requires that competitors in **all solo classes** must perform in two or more solo classes at the same grade/age group in the same discipline to be eligible for a Provincial Final recommendation. One of these classes must be a Provincial Finals eligible class.

Exception for Musical Theatre competitors: To be eligible for provincial recommendations, entrants must perform in two solo classes, however one of the solo classes may be in the vocal discipline.

Please note that first place winners of Provincial Finals Music classes may now be eligible to compete at the same level provided they are recommended from a local festival class one grade higher than the previous year.

2. Provincial Recommendation

Adjudicators may recommend **one or two representatives** (and an alternate) at each level indicated from each of the eligible disciplines.

3. Performance Requirements

Participants who choose to enter classes for adjudication only may not do so at a lower level than his/her competitive entries.

4. Accompaniment

The intent of SEMF and the Provincial Finals is to have live performances by both the performer and the piano accompanist; however, some situations may require modification of this rule and will be assessed on an individual basis. SEMF will not be obligated to provide a sound system if needed.

5. Original Scores

Performers are encouraged to perform from memory, but when a score is required, it must be an original and not a photocopy. All entrants must provide an original of their selection for the adjudicator's use. Legal electronic downloads must be accompanied by a receipt, with the exception of music downloaded from IMSLP (Public domain source). The performer will be ineligible for awards when unauthorized photocopies are used. Entrants providing selections for the adjudicator's use must have their books open and marked with their name and the class number. All music that is in loose page format must be presented stapled together or bound in some way.

Photocopies are not allowed except:

- where an entrant produces a letter from the publisher giving permission to photocopy.
- where an entrant produces correspondence from the publisher or music supplier, dated 60 days prior, stating the item is backordered and payment has been received.
- where a selection from a current high school operetta is selected for performance and permission to photocopy has been obtained.

6. Marking

The following classes will be adjudicated with no marks given: **Choral, Junior Piano** (Beginner), **Strings** (Suzuki and Beginner), **Musical Theatre** (10 years and under), **Vocal** (10 years and under). As a general guide, the following marking system is used:

Grade	Mark	Performance Standard
A +	90 to 100	signifies superior performance
A	85 to 89	signifies distinction
A -	80 to 84	signifies definite merit
B	75 to 79	signifies adequate
C	70 to 74	signifies fair standard

The decision of the adjudicator regarding ranking of participants must be accepted as final. At no time must anyone approach the adjudicator to discuss any matter.

7. Class Specific Regulations

Provincial eligible class numbers begin with the letter "P".

AMAF has introduced a 6th participation level eligible for Provincial recommendations in the new online syllabus:

- Primary (P) - vocalists 12 years & under and instrumentalists grades/levels 1-2
- Elementary (E) (previously known as Preliminary) - vocalists 14 years & under and instrumentalists grades/levels 3-4
- Junior (J) - vocalists 16 years & under and instrumentalists grades/levels 5-6
- Intermediate (I) - vocalists 18 years & under and instrumentalists grades/levels 7-8
- Advanced (A) - vocalists grade B and instrumentalists grades/levels 9-10
- Senior (S) - vocalists grade A & Honours and instrumentalists diploma/honours levels

8. General Procedures

SEMF Classes: SEMF will consider creating new classes to accommodate entries not eligible in existing classes. Note: Requests for new classes must be submitted by September 1 to be considered for the following year's festival.

Programming: The order of performances and approximate times will be shown in the official online program. Programs will be available to view at semf.ca in early February. There will not be physical copies for purchase.

The SEMF Committee reserves the right to grant or deny requests for program changes, to eliminate any class, and to create or remove finals in any class.

Requests for Scheduling Changes: *All requests for scheduling changes must be received in writing (email form; NO text messages), at least two weeks before the discipline start date.*

Scheduling changes will cause the entry to become for adjudication only. Send requests to the Discipline Coordinator. These requests will be evaluated by the Discipline Coordinator and other executive members as necessary. Please state your circumstances clearly in written form. SEMF does not guarantee that requested scheduling changes will be possible.

MULTI-DISCIPLINE & SPECIAL CLASSES

Please take note of the requirements for the Multi-Discipline Canadian Composers Classes, Pop/Contemporary Classes, and the Raleigh Family “W.A. Mozart” Classes.



PAPER ENTRY CHECKLIST

- Only complete entry forms will be accepted.
- Print clearly using black or blue ink.
- No staples or tape please.
- Do not write on the back of the entry form.
- Use correct class number and complete class name (copy this from the **Provincial Online Syllabus 2023 Edition**).
- Enter the composer and title of larger work if applicable.
- Use a separate entry form for each discipline.
- You may pay for more than one entry form with one cheque.
- IMPORTANT!** All entries must be received by December 1st. No late entries will be accepted, no exceptions.

ABSOLUTELY NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER DECEMBER 1, 2024.

- Entries received by mail will be accepted if they are postmarked by or on December 1, 2024. Entries dropped off at the Steinbach Cultural Arts Centre must be received on or before December 1, 2024. No entries will be accepted after December 1st.
- There are separate entry forms for: SOLO, ENSEMBLE (2 - 4 participants), GROUP (5+ participants), CHOIRS (Choral Workshop), and SPEECH (Speech Solos, Ensembles, and Choirs). **Incomplete entries may not be accepted.**
- CLASS NUMBER and CLASS NAME should be copied as written in the new online Provincial Syllabus or SEMF Addendum for accuracy.
- All entries must include the entry fee, preferably by cheque. Do not mail cash. Do not submit a purchase order.
- Changes may not be permitted once an entry has been received by SEMF. This will be evaluated by the SEMF on a case by case basis.
- The Committee reserves the right to redirect entries to a more appropriate class. Teachers will be notified of the change.
- Entrants are urged to check for possible conflicts with festival dates and indicate these on the entry form in the Program Considerations box at the bottom. Scheduling requests are seriously considered, however the committee is not always able to grant every request.
- The SEMF Committee reserves the right to grant or deny requests for program changes, to eliminate any class, and to create or remove finals in any class.

AWARD PROCEDURE

1. GENERAL PROCEDURE

- A. All scholarships and trophies will be awarded subject to a sufficient number of entries. Scholarships and trophies will be changed as needed at the SEMF Committee's discretion.
- B. **Piano, Vocal, Musical Theatre, Strings:** To be eligible for all solo awards, scholarships, and provincial recommendations, entrants must perform in two solo classes in these disciplines. Please carefully read on p. 17 requirements for Musical Theatre awards.
- C. Winners in duet classes may compete for the same award for two years.

2. SCHOLARSHIPS

- A. Scholarships will be awarded to a competitor that the adjudicator feels shows promise and is deserving in their discipline.
- B. To be eligible for scholarships, entrants must perform in two solo classes in their discipline.
- C. An entrant may not win the same scholarship more than two consecutive years, unless there are no other eligible entrants.

3. TROPHIES

- A. The trophy winner will be the TOP performer in his/her section. The participant's outstanding total performance and marks throughout the week shall be taken into consideration by the adjudicator. However, it does not necessarily follow that the competitor with the highest mark in his/her category receives the trophy. In all cases, the adjudicator's decision is final.
- B. Trophy winners may compete for two years in the same level, but must perform different repertoire.
- C. An entrant may not win the same trophy more than two consecutive years. An exception may be permitted if there is only one eligible competitor. SEMF Committee reserves the right to make this final decision.
- D. Trophies that are competed for annually shall be returned to the Steinbach Arts Center at least one month prior to the ensuing year's festival.
- E. The SEMF Committee is reviewing which trophies will be presented in the 2025 festival. This list will be available at the future date and will be included in the program.

4. AWARDS NIGHTS

- A. Awards Nights are final competitions for class winners in the following disciplines: Junior Piano, Senior Piano, Vocal, and Musical Theatre.
- B. Competitors are asked to make sure they have prepared the correct number of pieces for their level. Competitors may be required to verbally announce the piece(s) they are performing from onstage. Competitors should also be prepared to hand in original copies of their selection(s) for awards nights.
- C. No marks will be given at Awards Nights.
- D. Winners of recital classes do not continue on to the Awards Nights.
- E. **Piano:**
Solo competitors in grades 1-4 will be required to perform one selection at the Awards Night which will consist of the piece of the class he/she won.
Solo competitors in grades 5 and up will be required to perform two selections at the Awards Night which will consist of the piece of the class he/she won AND an additional own choice selection.
- F. **Vocal:**

Solo competitors up to and including the Intermediate level will be required to perform one selection at the Awards Night which will consist of the festival piece of the class he/she won.

Solo competitors in the Grade A, Grade B and Honours levels will be required to perform two selections at the Awards Night which will consist of the festival piece of the class he/she won, AND an additional own choice selection.

G. **Musical Theatre:**

Solo competitors will be required to perform one selection at the Awards Night which will consist of the festival piece of the class he/she won.

- **Piano** (Primary), (Elementary), (Junior), (Intermediate), (Advanced), (Senior)
- **Strings** (Primary), (Elementary), (Junior), (Intermediate), (Advanced), (Senior)
- **Musical Theatre** (Primary), (Elementary), (Junior), (Intermediate), (Advanced), (Senior)
- **TV/Movie Musical** (Primary), (Elementary), (Junior), (Intermediate), (Advanced), (Senior)
- **Operetta** (Junior), (Intermediate), (Advanced), (Senior)
- **Speech Arts** (Grade 4 and up)
- **Multi-Discipline Canadian Composers** (Primary), (Elementary), (Junior), (Intermediate), (Advanced), (Senior)
- **Multi-Discipline W.A. Mozart Class** (Primary), (Elementary), (Junior), (Intermediate), (Advanced), (Senior)
- **Multi-Discipline Popular/Contemporary** (Primary), (Elementary), (Junior), (Intermediate), (Advanced), (Senior)

Primary level corresponds to RCM/CC Grades 1 & 2 for Instrumentalists or ages 12 and under for Vocalists.

Elementary level corresponds to RCM/CC Grades 3 & 4 for Instrumentalists or ages 14 and under for Vocalists.

Junior level corresponds to RCM/CC Grades 5 & 6 for Instrumentalists or ages 16 and under for Vocalists.

Intermediate level corresponds to RCM/CC Grades 7 & 8 for Instrumentalists or ages 18 and under for Vocalists.

Advanced level corresponds to RCM/CC Grades 9 & 10 for Instrumentalists or Grade C (new) or Grade B for Vocalists.

Senior level corresponds to RCM/CC Diploma Level & Honours for Instrumentalists or Grade A & Honours for Vocalists.

Eligible classes are indicated in the Provincial Syllabus by a “P” preceding the class number. Multi-Discipline W. A. Mozart Classes are listed in the Provincial Syllabus, as well as the specific classes eligible for the Canadian Composers classes. The Southeastern Manitoba Festival Committee will choose two individuals and one alternate from those recommended in the multi-discipline categories after the completion of the Festival.
